



Lesson	A lesson that links Music apprenticeships with Music courses
Aim	To introduce the students to Music apprenticeships
Learning outcomes	By the end of the lesson the students will have a greater understanding of how the subject links to apprenticeships

	Plan	Resources needed
1	<p>IF YOU HAVE NOT GIVEN THIS OUT ALREADY</p> <p>LMI data fact sheet- introduce the lesson by handing out the LMI fact sheet. Highlight some of the key information on there during your discussion with the class.</p> <p>Play the videos that link to the fact sheet. You may want to ask the students to take notes or ask them questions at the end.</p>	<p>LMI factsheet</p> <p>LMI data videos</p>
2	<p>Setting the scene - Introduction</p> <p>Explain to the students that they have lots of options available to them when leaving school. They may opt to attend a sixth form or college and study the subject there. They could then apply for an apprenticeship after college or they could choose to apply for one straight after school e.g. Apprentice Sound Technician</p> <p>Inform the students that they could take a degree course in Music e.g. BA Sound & Music for Games, BA Music Production, BA Electronic Music, BA History & Music, BA Music Business, BA Music Journalism, BA Creative Music Technology, BA Music & Philosophy.</p> <p>Students could also apply for a job straight after sixth form.</p>	<p>A guide to apprenticeships has been provided by The National Apprenticeships Service. This guide can support you as a teacher if you are unsure about apprenticeships and how they work. You can also print out a copy for your students.</p>
3	<p>Ask them to carry out research on Music apprenticeships. Simply click on the link below to carry out your search; https://www.findapprenticeship.service.gov.uk/apprenticeshipsearch</p> <p>There is an option to filter the apprenticeship levels. Students should look at the intermediate, advanced and higher level apprenticeships on there. Please refer to the apprenticeships guide if the students are unsure about what the levels represent. Please note that there are currently no degree apprenticeships for music at the time of writing.</p> <p>Please note that sometimes apprenticeships may not be available in the area at that particular moment in time so you may want to extend the distance just to see what could be available in the future. Try to extend the filter to the rest of the UK. Please make sure that you enter a valid post code and distance too.</p> <p>Ask the students to click on some of them and present their findings in the Music Apprenticeship Search document</p>	<p>Log on move on main site</p> <p>Computers/lpads for carrying out research</p> <p>If you have no access to computers, you could access the site yourself in advance and print off a range of apprenticeships at all levels e.g. intermediate, advanced, higher etc.</p> <p>Apprenticeships guide</p> <p>Music Apprenticeship Search</p> <p>Apprenticeships website</p>

4	<p>Play the following apprentice case studies. You may also want to discuss any problems with the apprenticeships here e.g. salaries/wages could be much lower than a job e.g. apprenticeships have an average wage of £3.80 an hour at the time of writing although this is a training wage and not a final wage for a job. Some businesses will pay more.</p>	<p>Videos from the You tube links. You could ask the students to note down the key facts/benefits/issues whilst the videos are playing.</p>
